Children as snack monitors

Role play scenarios modelled by adults to support social skills

Praising examples of positive behaviour

Staff encourage children to participate in new activities

Role play of various emotions during circle time

Accessing high quality resources freely and independently for specific purpose

Talk together about how and why characters in our favourite stories are feeling

Peer support modelling positive relationships and actions

Self-registration using photographs or name cards to prompt name recognition

Quite area when children need to calm themselves

Communication and Language in Nursery

Language rich environment

Freely sharing books with others in the Reading Area

Daily story time

Adults modelling rich and subject specific language

Enjoy listening to longer stories and remembering much of what happens

Adults modelling correct grammar

Active story time using imagination and puppets

Story sacks/ puppet theatre

Show and Tell

Adults prompt with open ended questions - 'I wonder'

Opportunity to share experiences during daily circle time
