This week at Green Lea:

Class 1 (Fantastic Foxes)

The Artists of Class One have been busy this week continuing their exploration of colour. They have been inspired by Jackson Pollock to create their own abstract art. Our Reception children have already started applying their phonic knowledge to build CVC words (Consonant, Vowel, Consonant e.g. mat) and children in Nursery have been listening for rhyming words. Why not see how many rhyming words you can spot over the weekend.

Class 2 (Super Squirrels)

The Authors of Class Two have started to write their character description of Jack from Jack and The Beanstalk. To support them with this they have created a large Jack to go at the bottom of the beanstalk. Watch out Jack who's at the top? Quick pass me the axe! Ask your child to recall how they have chosen to describe Jack and why?

Class Two's Trip to Ford Green Hall

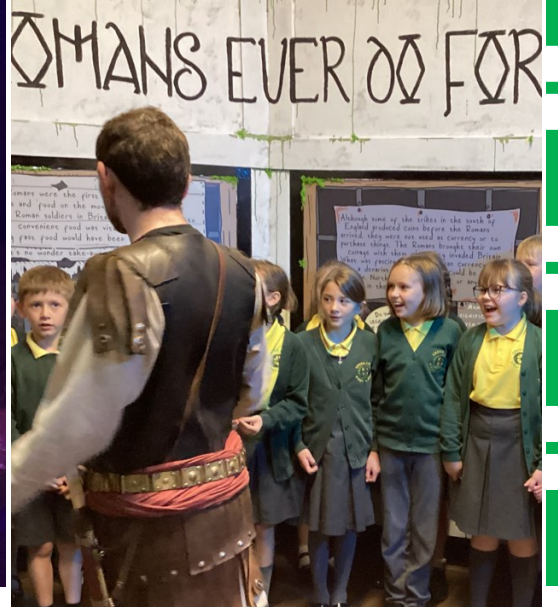
The children will leave school at approximately 9.15am and will arrive back by the end of the school day in time for normal collections.

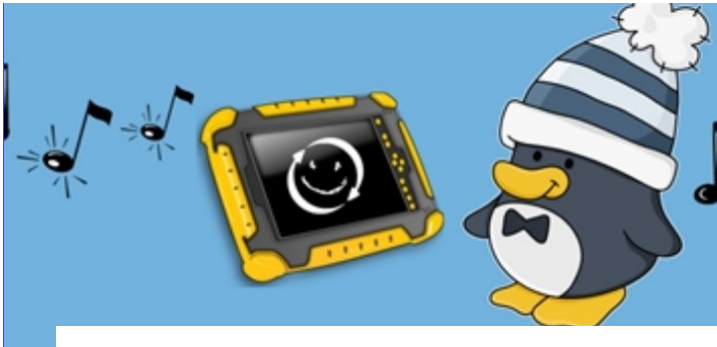

And TELL someone!

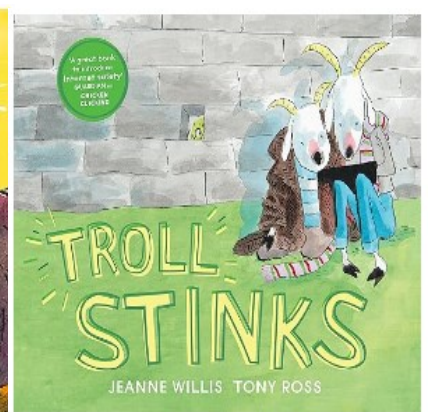
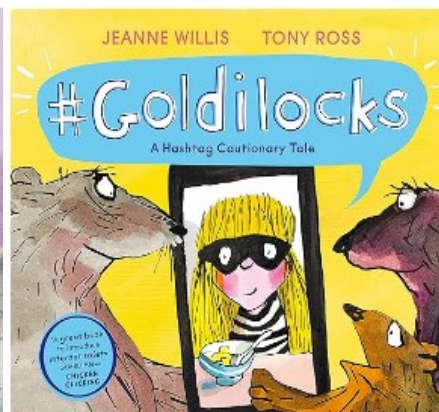
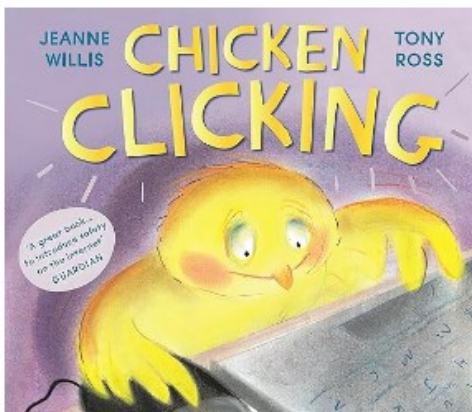
Key Learning in Class Two
