This week at Green Lea:

Class 1 (Fantastic Foxes)

Class 1 have really enjoyed reading Super Worm this week. It has inspired us to go on a search for super worms where we found some of his worm friends! The children loved going out in the rainy weather to dig up soil and find the different worms. Some children even liked holding them! In Maths, we have looked at patterns and positional language. We had fun using positional language to give directions to our friends and their teddies. We've also been singing songs and adding musical instruments to the music - its been noisy but lots of fun.

Class 2 (Super Squirrels)

To really embed our mathematical skills of position and direction, we created our own map on squared paper and then gave and wrote instructions for each other to move around the map. We used the mathematical language that we had been learning. In Science, we have grouped animals into various groups; pets and wild, mammal, bird, reptile, amphibian. Can they tell you what carnivore, herbivore and omnivore mean?

Class 3 (Super Seekers)

The Scientists of Class 3, have been learning about magnets. They have learnt about the parts of a magnet, have completed an experiment based on magnetic and non magnetic materials and have learnt what the words attract and repel means by investigating what happens when two magnets are close together. In Design and Technology, the children have researched, designed, created and then evaluated a purse or wallet that they have made showing their sewing skills by using running or cross stitch.

There were smiles all around at our Green Lea alumni event on Wednesday. It was so lovely to hear about how the children were getting on and a great opportunity to discuss what to expect.



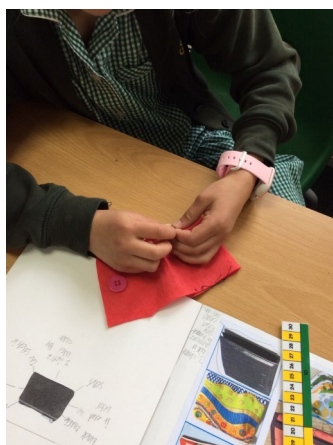
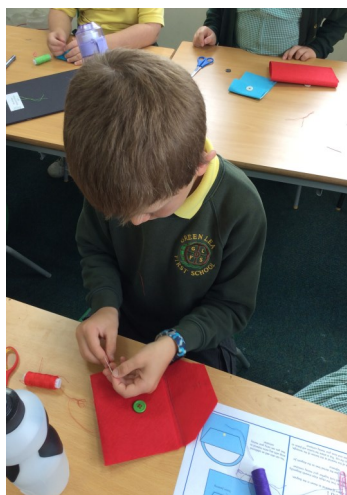
