

Place	Space
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Key Vocabulary

Seasons	The year is divided into four seasons; spring, summer, autumn, winter.
Temperature	A measure of how hot or cold something is.
Weather forecast	A prediction of what the weather will be like in the future.
Drought	When there is no rainfall for a long time.
Flooding	When dry ground is covered with a lot of water.
Blizzard	A very heavy snowstorm with high winds.
Heatwave	Unusually hot weather over a long time.
Hurricane	A storm with extremely strong winds.
Climate	The usual weather conditions of an area.
